Why This Tool Exists

Hiring a lawyer is a high-trust, high-stakes decision. These questions help you move beyond credentials—so you can choose someone who sees the full picture and holds it with care.

You're not interviewing them to impress.

You're checking whether they can hold your story—and your future.

What to Ask (and Listen Closely To)

- Communication & Containment
 - How will we communicate between appointments?
 - What's your response time if something urgent happens?
 - What can I expect from you emotionally—are you more direct, more collaborative, more contained?
- Clarity & Expectations
 - Can you help me understand the likely pathway from here?
 - What do you need from me to make this process efficient and clear?
 - What's your approach to conflict, escalation, or mediation?
- Cost & Transparency
 - What are your billing structures?
 - How do you handle scope creep or unexpected complexity?
 - Do you offer fixed-fee, brief consults, or written summaries?
- Fit & Strategy
 - What kind of clients or cases are the best fit for your approach?
 - Is there anything in my situation that you think needs urgent containment or clarity?

Anchor & Light

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What would success look like for you in a case like mine?

- To prepare emotionally before hiring from fear or urgency
